Dual Enrollment

During the 2020-2021 school year eligible high school students will be able to participate in Dual Enrollment opportunities.

Delivery of Dual Enrollment Courses:

- Depending on the College students should be prepared to engage in courses:
 - Face-to-Face
 - Hybrid/Blended
 - Full Virtual

Students must be able to maintain participation in high school courses and college courses by working on high school AND college online learning management system.

Dual Enrollment Opportunities include:

- Dual Enrollment- When a student is enrolled in high school and college courses and can earn high school and college credit simultaneously. **ELIGIBILITY: Students must have a satisfactory GPA of 2.5 or above and may participate in academic dual enrollment after successful completion of his or her 10th grade year.**
- Dual Credit- When a student is enrolled in high school and participating in designated courses that Huntsville City Schools and the Community College has agreed upon that can be used as substitutions to high school courses. Students will need to speak with his or her Counselor to see approved courses. **ELIGIBILITY: Students must have a satisfactory GPA of 2.5 or above and may participate in academic dual enrollment after successful completion of his or her 10th grade year.**
- Career Technical Dual Enrollment: (There is no limit on CTE Dual Enrollment courses. Students must meet eligibility requirements and have Counselor and Principal approval.) **ELIGIBILITY: Students must have a satisfactory GPA of 2.5 or above and may participate in career technical dual enrollment after successful completion of his or her 9th grade year.**

Dual Enrollment Basic Eligibility Criteria

1. The student has and maintains a 2.5 GPA (GPA requirements may vary depending on program of interest) in completed high school courses
2. The postsecondary level course is a course not offered at the high school
3. The student is a current 10th, 11th, or 12th grader (dual enrollment programs may have varying grade level requirements)
4. The student has met with his or her High School Counselor and the College Dual Enrollment Advisor.



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Dual Enrollment Procedures based on HCS Learning Frameworks

1. Students should contact his or her Counselor if interested in Dual Enrollment.
2. Depending on the school framework (traditional or virtual), students should be prepared to contact the school counselor either by email or phone.
3. School Counselors will complete the necessary information to gain approval from Huntsville City Schools.
4. Students should be prepared to complete the college of choice online application as well as participate in an advising session with the college's dual enrollment designee.
